- Provide high quality, specialist support to victims and survivors of sexual violence and child sexual abuse
- Increase awareness and understanding of sexual violence and child sexual abuse and the impact they have on victims and survivors, challenging myths and misconceptions

The services CARA provides for victims and survivors of sexual violence and abuse include:

- **ISVA (Independent Sexual Violence Adviser)** support through the criminal justice process and advocacy
- Specialist counselling for **adults**
- Specialist counselling and support for **young people**
- Play therapy for **children of 12 and under**, and support for their **families**
- A **women-only** social group
- **Workshops** and **training** on sexual violence, for professionals, schools and other agencies.
